The Nutcracker Story

The Nutcracker Story

The Nutcracker Ballet is based on the story "The Nutcracker and the King of Mice" written by E.T.A. Hoffman in 1816. It is the story of a young German girl who dreams of a Nutcracker Prince and a fierce battle against a Mouse King.

The Party: It is Christmas Eve at the Stahlbaum house. The Stahlbaums are hosting their annual Christmas party. The children, Clara and Fritz, are excited to see all of their friends and family. The party grows festive with music and dance as Uncle Drosselmeyer arrives. He is a skilled clock and toy maker and always full of surprises. Drosselmeyer draws everyone's attention as he presents life-size dolls. They are the delight of the party, each taking a turn to dance. Drosselmeyer presents his favorite niece with a beautiful Nutcracker Doll and she is thrilled and dances with her new treasured gift. Fritz, jealous that Clara receives this present, takes the doll and breaks it. Luckily Uncle Drosselmeyer is able to "magically fix the doll for Clara. As the evening grows late, the guests depart and the Stahlbaum family retires for the evening. Clara, thinking of her beloved Nutcracker, sneaks to find him and falls asleep with him in her arms.

The Battle:: As the clock strikes midnight strange things begin to happen. Clara begins shrinking as everything around her grows larger. Clara is quickly surrounded by giant Mice and their Queen and King. The Rat King corners the Nutcracker and battles him one-on-one. After a terrible battle and a final blow from the Nutcracker, the Rat King drops to the floor thankfully with the help of Dr. Peep Squeak and the love of the Queen Mouse, the King is revived and humbly takes his family and leaves the Staulbaum home.

The Land of Snow The Nutcracker turns into a Prince and takes Clara on a journey to the Land of Snow, an enchanted forest wonderland where they are welcomed by the beautiful Snow Princess and Snow Prince. As they travel through the wonderland they watch the beautiful Guardian Angel and Angels as well as the Snow Queen, Princess, Prince and Snow Flakes dance with delight. The Snow Queen gifts Clara with a beautiful jeweled crown.

The Land of Sweets. The Prince then escorts Clara to the Land of Sweets where they are greeted by the beautiful petit angels and their leaders. Clara receives dances and gifts from around the world. She receives Lollipops from Sweet Treats, Chocolate from Spain, Coffee from Arabia, Laughter from the Polichinelles, Tea from China, A song from the Peppermint Reed Pipes, a Trepak dance from Russia, and a bouquet of Flowers. Lastly, Clara is gifted with a beautiful dance from the Sugar Plum Fairy and her Cavalier. The Prince arrives and he escorts Clara home and she says goodbye to all of her wonderful "Sweet" friends.

Clara's Home: Clara awakens and finds herself by the Christmas tree with her beloved Nutcracker. She believes it was all just a dream, but then she finds the beautiful crown on her head given to her by the Snow Queen.

So...was it a dream or was it real?

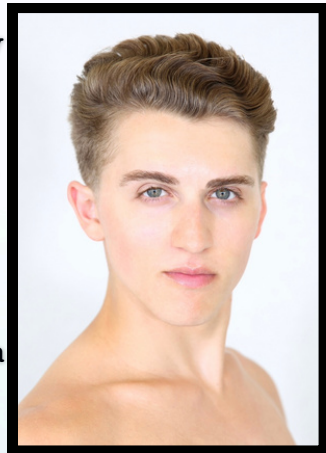
Tony Oates

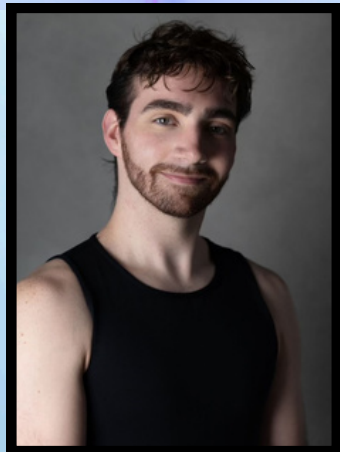

Molly Booth



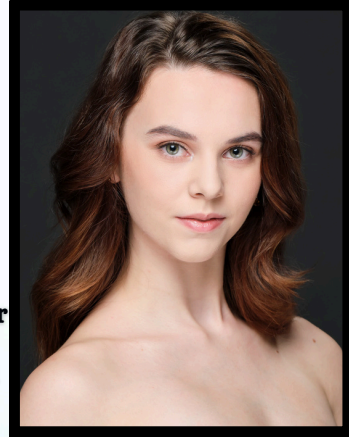

My favorite role in nutcracker is arabian because i just think its so beautiful and unique.



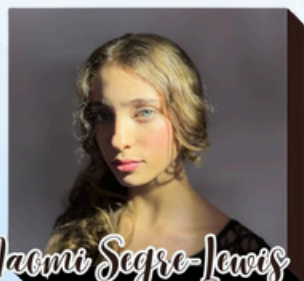
My favorite Nutcracker scene is snow scene because the music is so pretty and the ballet choreography is fun and challenging.

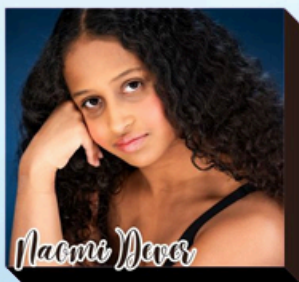

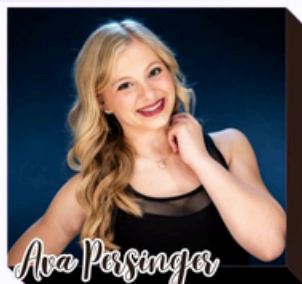

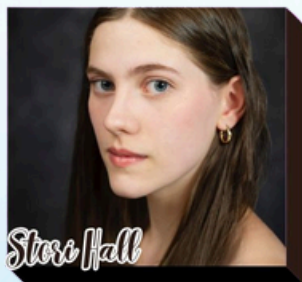
